III. Assignments

Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

- 1. Write a two to three page (double-spaced) reflection paper on any chapter of *Shepherding a Child's Heart*. A reflection paper identifies the subject(s) under consideration and gives a summarization of your reaction to the material with evidence from the material to support your suppositions. Reflection papers answer the questions "Did you agree with the claims of the author?," "What did you learn?," "What misconceptions did you have that the author helped you correct?" - 2. Develop a hypothetical 8 session premarital counseling plan for a young Christian couple. This plan should cover the following areas: conflict resolution, marital fidelity,



communication, leadership, and submission. Include the texts utilized in counseling, homework, and outline.

 Write an eight page paper (double-spaced) which explains a biblical understanding of marriage, divorce, and remarriage. Provide a cover page, bibliography, and footnote all citations. Be sure to utilize Kate L. Turabian, *A Manual for Writers of Research Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*, 9th Ed., (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Press, 2018) for pagination/citation questions. Refrain from relying upon secondary or internet sources.
