- 1. Complete the assigned reading.

- **3.** Write a five to eight page double spaced exegetical paper on a pericope in Galatians. Include at minimum five resources other than the assigned texts. Explain any textual issues relevant to your chosen pericope within the footnotes of your paper. Footnote all citations and include a cover sheet and bibliography.
- 4. Write a four page double spaced paper on Romans 9:5, answering the question, "Is the phrase 'who is God over all' attributed to Christ? Footnote all citations and include a cover sheet and bibliography.
