- 1. Complete the assigned reading.**

- 3. Write a five to eight page double spaced exegetical paper on a pericope in Galatians.** Include at minimum five resources other than the assigned texts. Explain any textual issues relevant to your chosen pericope within the footnotes of your paper. Footnote all citations and include a cover sheet and bibliography.
- 4. Write a four page double spaced paper on Romans 9:5, answering the question, "Is the phrase 'who is God over all' attributed to Christ?"** Footnote all citations and include a cover sheet and bibliography.
