- 1. Complete the asigned reading and lectures.

- 3. Write a two to three page (double-spaced) reflection paper on the history of the biblical couseling movement. Reflection papers answer the questions

- 4. Write an six page essay (double-spaced) comparing the differences between secular psychology, integrationism, and biblical counseling. Provide a general summarization of all three viewpoints followed by your critical evaluation. Footnote all citations.
- **5. Write a four page essay on Jay E. Adams**. Cover his life, education, accompliments, and his unique and remarkable contribution to the biblical counseling movement. Footnote all citations.
