Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

- 1. Read The Epistle to the Romans in its entirety.
- 2. Listen to lectures 1-53.
- 3. Write a four-page double-spaced exegetical on Romans 4:1-8. Consult commentaries, lexicons, and monographs, incorporating at least five written works aside from the assigned reading. Footnote all citations and provide both a cover page and a works cited page. Consult either the Chicago Manual of Style or Turabian for questions of citation and pagination.
- 4. Select a passage within Romans and produce three Sunday school lessons. These lessons should be geared toward an average adult Sunday school class within your church. Provide an outline for the class and three distinct lessons which provide both an overview of the book and a consideration of some of its highlights.
