3. Write a eight page double spaced research paper which describes the hypostatic union as taught in the Bible. Include a cover page and bibliography. Footnote all citations. Incorporate at least five resources (not web articles) in your paper other than those listed above.
4. Write a three page double spaced essay on Mary as *Theotokos*. Answer the question, "Do you view this title as appropriate?" Explain the implications of your viewpoint and provide historical and biblical evidence for your conclusion. Footnote all citations.
