IV. Assignments

Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

1. **Read pp. 529-1149 in *Systematic Theology*.**
2. **Watch/Listen to lectures 25-57.**
3. **Write a two-page double spaced reflection paper on a topic of interest in the assigned reading.** A reflection paper identifies the subject(s) under consideration and gives a summarization of your reaction to the material with evidence from the material to support your suppositions. Reflection papers answer the questions “Did you agree with the claims of the author?,” “What did you learn?,” “What misconceptions did you have that the author helped you correct?” Footnote all citations. 4. **Write a five to eight-page double-spaced research paper on the question of women serving in the office of pastor/elder.** This paper should include at least five written works aside from the assigned reading. Interact with at least two arguments from the position contrary to yours. Footnote all citations and provide both a cover page and a works cited page. Consult either the *Chicago Manual of Style* or Turabian for questions of citation and pagination.
