IV. Assignments

Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

- 1. Complete the asigned reading and lectures.
- 2. Create a series of sermon outlines for the entire Epistle of 2 Peter. Consult "How to Write Expository Sermon Outlines for Beginners."
- 3. Write a three to four page reflection paper on any area in the assigned reading or lectures. A reflection paper identifies the subject(s) under consideration and gives a summarization of your reaction to the material with evidence from the material to support your suppositions. Reflection papers answer the questions "Did you agree with the claims of the author?," "What did you learn?," "What misconceptions did you have that the author helped you correct?" - 4. Prepare two expository sermons on two consecutive passages in the Epistle of 2 Peter. Record each sermon and submit them along with the relevant manuscripts and other assignments to your supervisor.
