IV. Assignments

Written assignments should be turned in together at the close of a course.

- 1. Complete the assigned reading.
- 2. Listen/watch to the assigned lectures.
- 3. Write a four page double-spaced essay on the use of the decalogue in evangelism. Footnote all citations and include a bibliography. Consult either the Chicago Manual of Style or Turabian for questions of citation and pagination.
- 4. Spend a total of three hours engaging people with the gospel through street evangelism. Document your encouters in a word .doc and include the date, time, and a summary of each engagement.
- 5. Write a two to three page reflection paper on the necessity of evangelism within the local church. A reflection paper identifies the subject(s) under consideration and gives a summarization of your reaction to the material with evidence from the material to support your suppositions. Reflection papers answer the questions "Did you agree with the claims of the author?," "What did you learn?," "What misconceptions did you have that the author helped you correct?"
